## Simple Words of Faith from Dr. Hess

I am writing this article having recently spent 6 days in Cleveland with 3,000 + of our church leaders for our National UCC meeting called the General Synod and just last week spending 5 days in Pittsburgh on the Mission Trip with our Youth. Although both trips were very rewarding and I learned tons, I would not consider either time away from Hazleton as what I would term vacation or even Sabbath time. I know for the most part folks believe I have been on vacation (evidenced by the repeated queries, “How was vacation Pastor?” “Did you have a good time on vacation Pastor?” Usually this was followed by the question for my husband, “Did you go too?”). But it was not vacation it was indeed work time. Let me assure each of you that attending meetings morning, afternoon and evening at General Synod and being with our youth 24/7 is fun but... I was working. I am headed to Wildwood New Jersey next week with the Youth on a retreat called “Closer Walk” but again it is work. However, I do have a week of vacation scheduled in August to visit my sister Phyllis in Florida. Now that is 7 days to be spent with all my daughters, nieces and my little sister in West Palm Beach Florida, so yes, that will be vacation. But again, vacation is different from work and Sabbath. Sooo - work is not vacation. Vacation is not Sabbath time. And Sabbath time is not time away from my regular schedule of work. Seems like a circular argument.

What did you do for vacation this past summer?? Spending time away from work and with your family is vacation (sometimes) but it is not Sabbath time. You see we need work, we need vacation (time away from work) but more than vacation, we need Sabbath time. We believe in a God that is not a workaholic. After six days of work, God rested and instructed we mere mortals to go and do likewise. Keep the Sabbath and make it holy.

Sabbath means rest... to disconnect from our technology (which by the way can be as great an addiction as alcohol, or caffeine, or drugs). Take a day, or a half of a day, or just two hours and disconnect from your technology and rest. If you have trouble with two hours, then you may have to attend an AA meeting and admit the truth – I am an addict. Ok, most of us can restrain from picking up our phones while driving. But what happens at the stop light. We reach for our phones – until someone behind us beeps. Yikes. We really are addicted. It’s as if texting or tweeting or just flipping through Facebook is our only connection to others, friends, family, or the world. Not good. Kinda sad.

Like any addiction, we need to admit the truth, and then install helpful reminders along the way to keep up the motivation. So, every time we touch a door knob we will remember to pause, look around at the world in which we live and give thanks for a wonderful blessing in our lives. Or keep a one sentence journal (nothing fancy, just a moment in time to write a sentence about how you are doing). Or schedule time to connect with (a family member, old friend, God). Or just take the time to notice what is around you. Some folks have the impression that Sabbath means going to church, or doing good deeds (which it can) but for the most part it means rest. Relaxing by reading, watching a movie or even doing exercise or taking a walk is very good for us to do, but it is not rest.

There is a New Zealand Prayer that goes...

“What has been done – has been done.

What has not been done – has not been done.

Let it be.....Let it be.”

## LAY PASTOR'S CORNER

## Consistory Notes:

I am writing this article in the midst of summer. During the summer months we take time to vacation at the shore, to picnic at the lake, or to just sit on the porch with a cool drink. We barbecue, swim, and spend time with friends and family. By the time you read this article we will be transitioning from summer to fall. The sun is setting earlier and the evenings are getting cooler. Teachers, students, and parents are beginning the necessary, but often dreaded, back to school preparations. In the church, Sunday school and confirmation classes are forming and committee meetings are resuming. The beach, the lake, and warm evenings on the porch are now being written about in essays of "What I did this summer."

During this transition from summer to fall, our busyness seems to increase and times of fun and relaxation seem to decrease. I don't know about you, but I struggle with finding balance between work and rest. I am currently reading a book by Wayne Muller entitled *Sabbath: Finding Rest, Renewal, and Delight in Our Busy Lives*. Muller speaks of the rhythm of the seasons, the rhythm of the days, the rhythm of our lives and finding a balance between work and rest that keeps us in sync with these rhythms.

Muller defines the Sabbath as not only "the seventh day of the week, as in the Jewish

tradition, or the first day of the week as in the Christian tradition, but Sabbath time can also be an afternoon, an hour, or any time we set aside to savor the gifts of creation, and to give thanks for our many blessings. This is a time we make ourselves available to the insights and blessings that arise only in stillness and time."

The Gospel writers tell us that after preaching to the crowds and healing the sick Jesus often left the crowds and the disciples to rest and pray. After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray. (Mk 6:46) Great multitudes gathered to hear and to be healed of their infirmities. But he withdrew into the wilderness and prayed. (LK 5:15-16) Jesus renewed his body and soul with food, rest and prayer. He knew that maintaining a balance in his life was important for his ministry.

As we transition into this time of increased busyness and responsibilities, I encourage everyone to observe a day, and hour, a few moments of Sabbath time to renew your body and soul. Share a meal with friends, take an early morning walk, listen to music, read a book, write a poem, light a candle as the sun sets, pray and spend time just being with God. May you find delight in the wonder and rhythms of God's creation.
