Words of Faith....

You know when you have something you need to do but you just can't focus? (like writing this article for our Newsletter on the night before I am to leave at 4 a.m. for the airport to fly to Ireland on vacation – Easha!). Despite your earnest intention to get the job done, any (and every) distraction pulls at your attention like a dog seeing a squirrel. Instead of finishing the report, you find yourself scrolling through Instagram or researching what mulch or fertilizer to buy. You get everything ready to begin your project, and the next thing you know you find yourself standing in front of the refrigerator (for the second time in an hour) wondering what to eat. You start to write the article and midsentence remember the email you forgot to respond to the day before. What the heck!?! I have often attributed this phenomenon to my undiagnosed ADHD, but in talking with others I have now realized everyone can find their minds reeling like a pin ball in the finals tournament. I am not sure this is Biblical but I can imagine Moses in front of Pharaoh getting stressed out and coming up with a slew of plagues – ping/ping/pong – or Sara laughing at the (im)possibility that she would have a ping/pong – or even Jesus in the desert for 40 days, starving or rather fasting, and then trying to focus on what the devil was tempting him to do. Oh my.

Dr. Amishi Jha, a neuroscientist and Associate Professor of Psychology, along with Ali Katz, author of “One Minute to Zen: Go From Hot Mess to Mindful Mom” both suggest that it's all about refocusing your attention, calming down your nervous system, and coming back to center so you can move forward in your day.” The “Name Three Things” practice may help. Take three deep breaths and after each name (out loud) one thing that you see. Then doing the breathing thing again, name (out loud) three things you smell, one breath at a time. And finally breathe and name three feelings you have (one breath at a time). Now you are going to do the same three steps but this time naming 2 things you see, hear and feel. When you are done do it again naming just one thing you see, hear and feel. When you are finished take a full cleansing breath. Notice that you are a bit more centered. Go back to your day.

Dr. Jha has found wonderful results in her work with soldiers going into battle and even those with post traumatic stress disorder. You too may find yourself in control and able to respond open and honestly with your Pinball-Machine mode. I did. Ta Da

## Report of the Spring Meeting

### Penn Northeast Conference of United Church of Christ

Saturday May 4, 2019. 9 AM to 4 PM

Theme: Rejoice! Rejoice in the Lord always!

As one of your delegates to the Spring meeting of Penn Northeast Conference of the United Church of Christ, this is a brief summary of meeting events. Along with me as delegate was Lisa Brown, Rev Dr Jane Hess attended as well.

There were 168 people in attendance, 71 churches represented, and 106 ministers present.

The Worship and Holy Communion Service led by Rev. Dr. Gregory Edwards, pastor of Resurrected Life Community Church was very meaningful. Rev. Edwards has a robust singing voice. The service included a soloist and interpretive dance. Rev. Edwards sermon was one of “Search and Rescue” and Love of One Another.

During the business meeting, Resurrected Life Community Church was approved by the delegates as a congregation with standing in the United Church of Christ. The Conference Board unanimously approved this motion at their meeting on April 24, 2019.

Rev. Creyer, conference treasurer, announced PNEC has finished the year slightly ahead of expenses. Churches are encouraged to increase giving to OCWM.

There was also election and installation of Board and Committee members and General Synod Delegates.

“5 for 5” Recognitions were held. 5 for 5 includes OCWM, and 4 special offerings, One Great Hour of Sharing, The Christmas Fund, Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need. Faith UCC was included in 5 for 5 Recognition. Thank you for your contributions!

Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates, Conference Minister, spoke on visioning PNEC into the 21st century which included a commitment to love all people.

There were small group gatherings in the afternoon. We attended Congregational Vitality and 3 Great Loves. Discussion included how to get “Good and Faithful Work Done”.

Also, love of neighbors, love of creation and love of children, sharing stories of church activities.

Closing prayer was held in the Sanctuary.

Lessons From a Perfectionist

Greetings, faith family! For a few weeks now bookmarks have been available to us in church with life lessons from different folks, groups, and even our pets. I hope you don't mind but I thought I would jump on the bandwagon. Not as a teacher or pastor, rather as someone who is flawed and the lessons it has taught me. For as long as I can remember I have been a perfectionist. It pretty much began when I was in junior high school and I was intentionally moved from the top section of the seventh grade to the middle section because of my hearing impairment. The message that rang loud and clear to me, intentional or not, was that I was not smart enough to be in this group. So...I put my nose to the grindstone and worked my way to the top of the class. Ha! Now they had no choice but to put me in the top section and there I stayed for the rest of my junior high and high school years. However, now I was determined not to let anyone tell me I wasn't good enough and it became an obsession with me. Then when I was in college one of my professors suggested that she work with me for speech therapy because as an elementary education major my speech, due to my hearing impairment, might affect my chances at getting hired. Here we go again...not good enough. I became very intimidated speaking in front of people. Over the years people were still making comments about my speech and as a result I have become very self-conscious about who I am.

The result of all this is to say that finally in 62 plus years of life I have learned some lessons from my life as a perfectionist no matter what hat I am wearing; student, mother, teacher, friend, pastor and so on. No one is perfect – stop trying to be perfect, accept yourself for who you are, imperfections and all. Be gentle with yourself, the world is hard enough on you. In the words of the Psalmist, "I am fearfully and wonderfully made..." Accept life on life terms – there is so much in this life that is out of our control. Learn to live one day at a time. Do not look back to the past and ask, "What if...?" Do not look to the future and ask, "What will I do if..." Live in the present moment. Pray for strength and guidance when you feel overwhelmed by life. Perfectionism produces procrastination, worry, fear, and anxiety so it's easy to become overwhelmed. "God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference." You are not going to please everyone all the time, so stop trying. And you are not responsible for anyone else's happiness. Enjoy the journey. Every day is not going to be perfect. Don't let the bumps in the road or the failure to meet unrealistic expectations decrease your enjoyment in life.

God is God and we are not. Amen.
