Our Jewish sisters and brothers believe that there are two deaths. The first death is the death of the body, no more breath. The second death is when people forget you, no more life. It is rather profound. One of the (many) things that Faith United Church of Christ does well, is taking the time to remember those of our church family and those of each other's families. We do this religiously and with great care. It is good.

The yahrzeit is a one year anniversary of a person's death. Jewish tradition suggests that the family light a yahrzeit candle and reflect on that person's life. This is quite similar to what I have asked at many funerals of our loved ones – "If this person's life were a sermon, what is God trying to teach us through her/his life?"

January 13th was Rabbi Weinberg's 10th yahrzeit. On this occasion we were all asked to spend some time answering the following daily questions from him.

1. Are you confronting your fears and continuously stepping out of your comfort zone? Life is too short to play it safe. Get moving.
2. What are you living for? What is driving you to wake up early and tackle life? Know where you want to go and passionately work on getting there.
3. Have you given up unleashing your inner greatness? Don't settle on being a mediocrity. Work hard to bring out your inner light and dazzle the world.
4. Do you remember that the Almighty loves you, believes in you and is rooting for you? Get your ego out of the way and let the Almighty in.
5. Are you getting inspired by the beauty of the Torah (Bible) ? You have the blueprint of creation in your hands. Dive in!
6. How are you committing suicide in installments? Stop wasting time and get the most out of life. Remember, the battle for life is the battle for sanity. Words of encouragement, words of admonition and words of inquiry..... God calls us to live the life we have been given and live it fully not fool-ly. How will you be remembered?



- 24 heavy duty (45 gallon) contractor type trash bags
- 9 oz. non-aerosol insect repellent

While I'm not much for New Year's resolutions (they somehow get away from me too easily!), I am experiencing new adventures in my faith daily.

It's so challenging everyday beginning again to offer up the day to God, and before you know it, I've slipped somewhere. Sigh.

But I realized how real the struggle can be as I studied the scripture for this past weekend – the wedding at Cana. We are not alone. Even Jesus struggled. Looking at Mary's request for help with the wine, Jesus felt the conflict between the expectations of his heavenly parent and his human parent. Was that why he answered that way? Understanding that his wording was not unusual for that time period, it still sounds to me like the frustrated response that comes out of us when we are faced with an emotional conflict. This is us when we struggle to mediate between siblings, to express an opposite opinion lovingly to someone dear to us, to know we must choose the hard way because it's the right way.

Consistory Notes

Consistory mtg 1/13. It was reported that the 200 Club tickets were all sold and the Advent offering appeal went well.

However, we ended the year 2018 in the red. We transferred \$37,000 from the Money Market not only to help pay the extra \$2,300 per month on our mortgage but also to pay \$9,700 of our regular bills. The consistory put a freeze on spending and voted to make regular mortgage payments (\$10,700 per month).

We still have \$69,000 in Money Market and \$28,000 CD and \$37,000 CD invested with the United Church of Christ Cornestone Foundation the latter two CDs are earning better interest than the money market. The Halupki Sale will be held in February, Lucky Number Tickets in March and the Book Sale and Stuffed Pepper Soup in April are on track to 'up the income'.

But only God can make a tree.



Did You Know Charitable Giving Opportunities??

Did you know if you are 70 years and 6 months or older your retirement fund is required by law to make distributions or RMD (Required Minimal Distribution)? If you were to inform your retirement fund manager that you wanted them to make a direct contribution of any dollar amount, called Qualified Charitable Distribution, to Faith UCC, they will do so AND you will not have to pay taxes on that amount. This is part of the 2018 Tax Law Change. If you are interested in more information on this please contact your accountant or your retirement fund manager. After you receive your distribution, it is too late to make that decision. However, if you receive monthly/quarterly disbursements you may decide before each disbursement.
